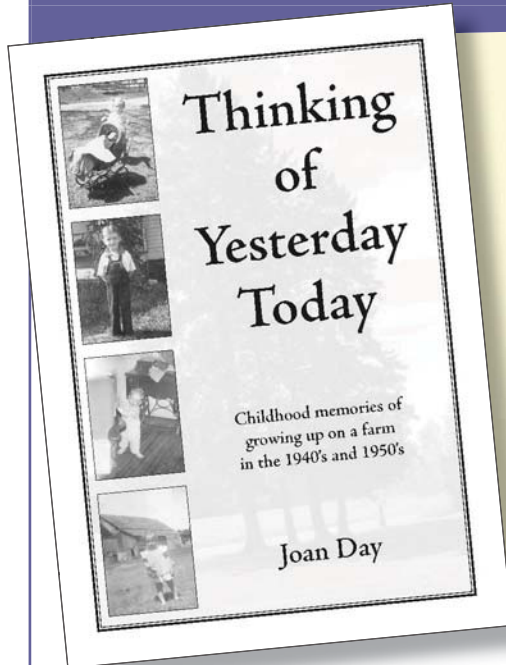

"For those who grew up in rural northern New England or those who wish they had, Thinking of Yesterday Today will have a coming-home feeling."

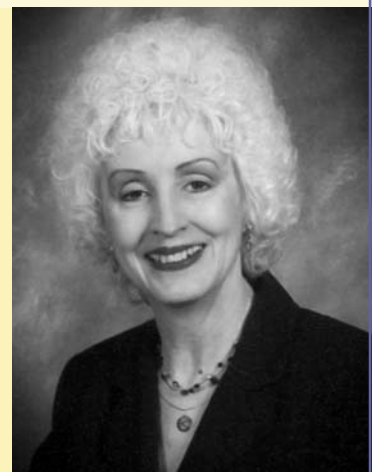
